



Basic Materials Needed:

- 1 Pad or Block of 9 x 12 140lb Cold-Pressed Watercolor Paper (Arches)
- 3-4 round watercolor paintbrushes (suggested sizes: 4, 6, 10 and 1" wash brush)
- Paints in a Palette (Winsor Newton or Daniel Smith primary colors in cool / warm options, at least; contact for specific suggestions)
- Pencil & Kneaded Eraser
- Painter's Tape (if using loose paper) & particle board to mount paper on
- 2 clear water containers & some paper towels

Expanded Material List (not necessary - use them if you like):

• **Paint:** For beginners not wanting to invest much in materials a basic watercolor palette from a place like Michaels will do: https://www.michaels.com/36-color-watercolor-pan-set-by-artists-loft-necessities/10122060.html

At the intermediate or advanced level, you should have a palette already set up with a variety of paints. If not, you will need at least 3 primary colors in warm and cool options plus a few convenience colors of your choice (pre-mixed greens, browns, grays, blacks, etc.). I recommend the brands below. For a more economic option, the **Winsor & Newton Cotman brand** is for students and less expensive than professional lines.

WINSOR & NEWTON (Professional or Cotman Student-Grade)

Warm yellow: Winsor Yellow Deep Cool yellow: Cadmium Yellow Warm red: Cadmium Red Cool red: Permanent Rose Warm blue: Ultramarine Blue



Cool blue: Pthalo Blue

Extras / Optional: Hookers Green, Indigo, Sepia, Paynes Gray, Burnt Sienna

Cool yellow: Hansa Yellow Light Warm yellow: New Gamboge Cool red: Quinacridone Rose Warm red: Pyrrol Scarlet Cool blue: Pthalo blue GS Warm blue: French Ultramarine

Extras / Optional: Jane's Gray, Burnt Sienna, Phthalo Green

- **Paper:** 9 x 12 or 12 x 16 inches; 140lb cold-pressed watercolor paper BLOCK or Pad (10-20 sheets); Arches is great and available at Michael's, Asel Art, & online at Amazon.
- 1x roll of regular masking tape or Blue Painter's tape (blue)
- 1 x piece of particle board several inches larger than the paper you are using (18 x 24); check at Lowe's / Home Depot or art stores.
- 2 x CLEAR water containers (plastic take-out containers with lids work great)
- 1 x kneaded eraser (look for these in a craft or art store)
- Pencils
- Palette of Choice, preferably one with plenty of space to mix colors (John Pike Palettes are my favorite but I also love the Butcher trays. You can also use an old white dinner plate)
- Brushes: These are the basic brushes you will need for my class, but feel free to get more. My preferred brand which is good for serious painting but not too expensive is the **Silver Black Velvet** brand it is a mixed synthetic / squirrel hair brush.

1 x 1-inch flat brush (for washes)

1x size 4 round brush

1x size 6 and / or 8 round brush

1 x 10 and/or 12 round brush

- A roll of paper towels / a few cotton rags (cut up old t-shirts work great)
- A ruler (preferably clear)

OPTIONAL MATERIALS:

- Very small spray bottle filled with water
- Table salt in small container
- Masking fluid (frisket) and pick-up tool
- Disposable plastic spoon, small
- Scrap watercolor paper for testing colors
